Today is Transfiguration Sunday, a transitional Sunday between the ordinary time after Epiphany and the beginning of Lent. All of the readings are connected to one another on this day, with a focus on the gospel reading. We celebrate this now precisely as a reminder that the one who leads us through the coming season of penitence and preparation is preparing us to participate in such glory with him both now and at his second coming.
