#### **Holiday Hygiene Drive - Through December 18**

This holiday season, Highlands is partnering with the Jefferson County Memorial Project in a Hygiene Drive for Donaldson Correctional Facility. The men incarcerated there are allowed a limited quantity when ordering these products, and often pay greatly inflated prices. Acceptable items include: shampoo, conditioner, body soaps/gels, toothbrushes, toothpaste, alcohol-free mouth wash, deodorant, lotion, peppermints/hard candies, legal pads and notebooks (no spiral bound), pocket planners, and socks.
