Winter Adult Sunday School Classes

THE BLESSING OF A SKINNED KNEE

Mom, Educator, Principal of the Year and mediator Nancy Barkemeyer will help us explore how to raise children who are grateful and more self reliant. Using NYT best-selling author Wendy Mogal's book *The Blessing of a Skinned Knee*, and sharing stories of everyday parenting problems and examining them through the lens of the Torah, the Talmud, and important Jewish teachings, Nancy will lead us away from habits of over-protection, overindulgence and over-scheduling our children's lives to raising more self-disciplined, grateful and resourceful children.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

Dr. Larry Brasher, Professor of Religion - Emeritus at Birmingham- Southern College will lead a class on the foundational beliefs of Christianity as presented in the Apostles' Creed. This class will explore the Apostles' Creed which has origins in the second century and was considered a faithful summary of the faith of the apostles. The class will look at teachings about God, the Incarnation (the humanity and divinity of Jesus), the Atonement (the death of Jesus). the Trinity, and the Resurrection and its implications for individuals and the world.

TWO PEAS IN A GOD POD: A DIFFERENT LOOK AT FAITH AND RELIGION

Dr. Weily Soong and Dr. Sonya Heath will help explore faith and religion through six wonderful, curated podcasts worth listening to, pondering, and discussing together. This class is a terrific opportunity to practice having better religious conversations with one another.

Podcast selections include *On Being with Krista Tippet* (episodes with Richard Rohr and John O'Donohue), *All There Is With Anderson Cooper* (Stephen Colbert: Grateful for Grief), *Clear + Vivid with Alan Alda* (David Brooks: How To Know A Person), and more!

CONTEMPLATIVE SUNDAY SCHOOL - ONCE A MONTH

All adults are invited to a new kind of Sunday School class – a once-a-month contemplative experience. These classes will incorporate devotion, reflection, journaling, intentional listening, and something to stir creativity.
