



The Festival of Lessons and Carols was first held on Christmas Eve in 1918. The religious service was planned by Eric Milner-White who, at the age of thirty-four, had been recently appointed Dean of King's College in Cambridge, England. Experience as an army chaplain had convinced him that the Church of England needed more imaginative worship. The purpose of the original service was to provide Christmas worship before the students left for the holiday break. A revision of the Order of Service was made in 1919, involving rearrangement of the lessons, and from that date the service has always begun with the hymn, "Once in Royal David's City." The lessons and prayers of the service have remained virtually unchanged since that time. The service alternates between scriptures read from the Old and New Testaments of the Bible and carols sung by the choirs. At the beginning of the service, the choristers move in procession from west to east. This is symbolic of human's desire to turn away from the darkness and sin in which they have been separated from God and to draw closer to the light of God through Jesus Christ.


