That we are dust is a reminder that our lives are fragile, and that the lives and hearts of those around us are as well. We then must tread lightly and walk joyously, spreading love for hate, peace for rancor, and healing for a world that is all too wounded. That we are dust is a reminder that in our material existence there is a limitedness, a boundedness that leaves the reality of who we are all too often far from the people that we wish to be. We are left needing the help of our friends, family, and indeed our God to press forward. This simple yet profound common reality of our existence is the call to freedom and to patience, peace, and a humility within ourselves, which can reconcile who we are in reality with whom God has created us to be.

That unto dust we will return, though, is the challenge. Now is the time to cast off the darkness of our own hearts. Now is the time to rid ourselves of the chains, addictions, and habits which hold us bound. Now is the time to repair those wounded friendships, and to remember once again the joy that we had in them. The time is now because we are returning to dust, and there is no other time. Life is far too short, our time to love far too brief, our joy always far too limited. Now is the time; there is no other moment. The spring, which can never be held back, is coming. Remember that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return.

## INVITATION TO OBSERVE A HOLY LENT

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: the early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty day season of spiritual preparation. During this season converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when persons who had committed serious sins and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to participation in the life of the Church. In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith. I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to observe a holy Lent: by self examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word. To make a right beginning of repentance, and as a mark of our mortal nature, let us now bow before our Creator and Redeemer.
